

How do we let Jesus Christ be our mentor?




Our Source for Remission of Sins

Prophetic Priority

"And saying, Repent ye: for the kingdom of heaven is at hand." (Matthew 3:2)

Please notice that the first word spoken by John as recorded in the New Testament is *repent*.

"From that time Jesus began to preach, and to say, *Repent:* for the kingdom of heaven is at hand." (Matthew 4:17)

Again, notice that *repent* is the first recorded word of the Savior's public ministry.




"Say nothing but repentance unto this generation; keep my commandments, and assist to bring forth my work." Doctrine & Covenants 6:9; 11:9

"Come Unto Me"

Yea, he saith: Come unto me and ye shall partake of the fruit of the tree of life; yea, ye shall eat and drink of the bread and the waters of life freely... Alma 5:34

What does it mean to you to come unto Christ?

Alma 5:49

"And now I say unto you that this is the order after which I am called, yea, to preach unto my beloved brethren, yea, and every one that dwelleth in the land; yea, to preach unto all, both old and young, both bond and free; yea, I say unto you the aged, and also the middle aged, and the rising generation; yea, to cry unto them that they <u>must</u> repent and be born again."

Why must we repent?





"Repenting is the first and natural consequence of placing our trust and confidence in the Savior. Described most simply, repentance is turning away from evil and turning to God. As we exercise faith in and on the Lord, we turn toward, come unto, and depend upon Him. Thus, repentance is trusting in and relying upon the Redeemer to do for us what we cannot do for ourselves."

"... repentance as the process of turning to God is an encouraging, hopeful, and recurring theme. As we study the scriptures, our understanding of this principle can be increased by mentally inserting the phrase "turn unto the Lord" each time we encounter the word repentance."


What is Repentance?

- I say unto you, that likewise joy shall be in heaven over one sinner that repenteth, turns unto the Lord more than over ninety and nine just persons, which need no repentance. Luke 15:7
- Yea, repent turn unto the Lord and be baptized, every one of you, for a remission of your sins; yea, be baptized even by water, and then cometh the baptism of fire and of the Holy Ghost. – D&C 33:11
- Hath he commanded any that they should not partake of his salvation? Behold I say unto you, Nay; but he hath given it free for all men; and he hath commanded his people that they should persuade all men to turn unto the Lord repentance. – 2 Nephi 26:27

What is Repentance?

The word for repentance in the Greek New Testament is metanoeo. The prefix meta- means "change." The suffix - noeo is related to Greek words that mean "mind," "knowledge," "spirit," and "breath."





What is Repentance?

- Thus, when Jesus asks you and me to "repent," He
 is inviting us to change our mind, our knowledge,
 our spirit—even the way we breathe. He is asking
 us to change the way we love, think, serve, spend
 our time, treat our wives, teach our children, and
 even care for our bodies.
- Nothing is more liberating, more ennobling, or more crucial to our individual progression than is a regular, daily focus on repentance. Repentance is not an event; it is a process. It is the key to happiness and peace of mind. When coupled with faith, repentance opens our access to the power of the Atonement of Jesus Christ.

Discovering the Joy of Daily Repentance

- "How important is repentance? Alma taught that we should "preach nothing save it were repentance and faith on the Lord." Repentance is required of every accountable person who desires eternal glory. There are no exceptions."
- "Please do not fear or delay repenting. Satan delights in your misery. Cut it short. Cast his influence out of your life! Start today to experience the joy of putting off the natural man. The Savior loves us always but *especially* when we repent."

Sincere Repentance

Sincere Repentance



Specialized Care

"We all understand that certain physical injuries or illnesses require the specialized care of a qualified health professional. In like manner, serious spiritual wounds can be healed only with the assistance of a properly authorized servant of the Lord. Stake, mission, and district presidents; bishops; and branch presidents, acting in the authority of the priesthood keys they received when they were set apart, are commissioned representatives of the Redeemer, who provide essential help in the repentance and healing processes. These leaders are physician's assistants who can diagnose spiritual illnesses and prescribe necessary medications and treatments."


Honesty in Repentance

Becoming and Staying Clean

As members of the Lord's restored Church, we are blessed by our *initial* cleansing from sin associated with baptism and receiving the gift of the Holy Ghost. And that first blessing is magnified by the potential for an **ongoing** cleansing from sin made possible through the constant companionship and sanctifying power of the Holy Ghost—even the third member of the Godhead. These joyous blessings are vital because "no unclean thing can dwell with God."







The Role of the Sacrament

"The act of partaking of the sacrament in and of itself does not remit sins. But as we repent, prepare conscientiously, and participate in this holy ordinance with a broken heart and a contrite spirit, the promise is that we may *always* have the Spirit of the Lord to be with us. And then, by the sanctifying power of the Holy Ghost, we can *always* retain a remission of our sins."

Spiritual Renewal

"Our Heavenly Father and His Beloved Son do not intend for us to experience spiritual renewal, refreshment, and restoration just once in our lives as we are baptized, receive the gift of the Holy Ghost, and are confirmed as members of the Lord's restored Church. 


Faith and Repentance

We must never short-change the teaching of repentance


For each person, the repentance is individual, but it is universally necessary. "For all have sinned and come short of the glory of God."

Confession

- "By this ye may know if a man repenteth of his sins—behold, he will confess them and forsake them" (D&C 58:43)
- "I, the Lord, forgive sins unto those who confess their sins before me and ask forgiveness" (D&C 64:7)
- "When he shall be guilty in one of these things, that he shall confess that he hath sinned in that thing: And he shall bring his trespass offering unto the Lord for his sin . . . and the priest shall make an atonement for him [by sacrifice]" (Lev. 5:5–6; see also Num. 5:7–8).
- "And now, it came to pass that there were many who heard the words of Samuel, the Lamanite, which he spake upon the walls of the city. And as many as believed on his word went forth and sought for Nephi; and when they had come forth and found him they confessed unto him their sins and denied not, desiring that they might be baptized unto the Lord." Helaman 16:1
