Ether



Alma


And now it came to pass that the sons of Alma did go forth among the people, to declare the word unto them. And Alma, also, himself, could not rest, and he also went forth.

Where does courage come from?

"In addition to authority, you need spiritual power to fulfill your calling. God gives spiritual power as you consistently (Courageously) work to strengthen your testimony of Him, Jesus Christ, and the gospel truths you teach. He bestows spiritual power as you pray, study the scriptures, and seek to fulfill your missionary purpose. He grants spiritual power as you strive to keep His commandments and the covenants you made when you received the ordinances of salvation" (Power and authority of your calling chapter 1, new PMG)

Six steps to being courageous

- 1. Cultivate a desire to be courageous (Enos 1:9; Alma 32:27; Alma 22:15-16; D&C 137:9; Mosiah 28:3; PMG 2 chapter 9, pg 166)
- 2. Powerful personal scripture study Alma 17:2-3; PMG 2, pg 19 Seek the Spirit
- 3. Pray in faith and by faith Doctrine and Covenants 42:14
- 4. Gain a testimony of Christ Alma 5: 46-48
- 5. Live worthy of your calling Doctrine and Covenants 35:24 The blessings flowing down into your life are coming through your covenant connection with God.
- 6. Just go Remember, faith is a principle of action and of power. Exercise faith to find. Exercise faith when you teach.

- We continuously invite people to make and keep commitments
- We invite everyone that has come to church or is keeping commitments to be baptised and confirmed
